



**Excursions from Nicosia, with qualified

**Paphos ( 09:00 )**

After breakfast we begin our excursion to Paphos 9.00 -17.30 Hours

An opportunity to discover Paphos, one of the most beautiful parts of the island. On the way we stop to see the birthplace of Aphrodite (Venus), the Goddess of Love and Beauty from the Greek Myths. In Paphos we take you first to the House of Dionysus, with its stunning mosaics- some of the finest in the Mediterranean. We then pass by the Odeon amphitheatre, we pass by the "Catacombs of St. Solomoni" and we see Panagia Chrysopolitissa Church, built over the ruins of the early Byzantine Basilica. St. Paul's Pillar is at the same place. The spot, where according to tradition, St. Paul was beaten "forty times minus one". At the same place, after St. Paul's miracle over the magician Selim, the Roman Governor Sergious Paul was converted to Christianity.

We stop by the Byzantine Castle of Forty Columns to reach Paphos harbor. After a stroll and Lunch, (optional) Return to the Hotel in Nicosia

**Troodos Mountains ( 09:00 )**

After breakfast we begin our excursion to Troodos Mountains 9.00 -17.30 Hours

We drive to this beautiful excursion to the Cyprus Mountains. We continue to a World Heritage Site to visit the Church of Saint Nikolas followed by a walk in the old part of Kakopetria village, with its unique mountain setting and traditional architecture. We drive through the Troodos mountain forest with pine wood trees. Then we visit KYKKOS monastery the most famous and the reaches s monastery in Cyprus. In this monastery Saint Mary Icon is one of the three icons Saint Lucas Created. The group will have lunch (optional). Return to the hotel in Nicosia.
